


Every year in November, light festival Glow takes place in Eindhoven. Dozens of national and international light artists showcase their work at various locations in the city of light.

Today you are going to paint your own imagined alien.


An artist will turn many of your aliens into a large artwork for Glow.

Step 1: Think about what your alien should look like. Make several drawings.


Step 2: Choose your favorite alien.

Step 3: Decide which 2 bright colors your alien will have.

Step 4: Paint your alien.

Step 5: Give your alien eyes, spots, hair, shoes, or something else.





Think about what your alien should look like. Make several drawings.



Choose your favorite alien.

GLOW



Paint your chosen alien large on the thicker paper with a little water.



Choose 2 bright and striking colors that suit the character of your alien. First, paint parts of your alien with the first color.



Then paint the rest of your alien with the second color.



The colors will blend a bit, which is normal. But you must not mix them on purpose.



Let your alien dry well.



Use a marker to give your alien eyes, spots, hair, shoes, or come up with something else.
